Day 2— Assemble your 24-page booklet:

Step 1 Reread the prompt. See Page 2.

Step 2 Reread your words, phrases and sentences (See Pages 4, 5, and 6) as you revise to make sure that PICTURES (See Page 3) and WORDS/PHRASES/SENTENCES answer the prompt.

You may need to add, cross out, or move pictures, drawings, words, phrases, even sentences.

Day 3—Revise your Pictures/Drawings, and Write the Final Version of your Words, Phrases or Sentences.

Look for the following to help you describe your pictures/drawings and say what you mean:

I fully described EACH of my 72 PICTURES or DRAWINGS using a WORD (Noun), PHRASE or SENTENCE (that include Nouns) for each.

I numbered each of my pictures from 1 to 72 (at least).

I numbered each of the 24 PAGES in my booklet.

I included the TABLE OF CONTENTS (See PROMPT on Page 2) as the First Page in my booklet.

I entitled my booklet "My Book of NOUNS!!!" and identified myself as the Author of the booklet. I also included the date when I completed my booklet and turned it in.

I wrote in third person

I chose the words, especially the nouns, that best express my descriptions and ideas

I used new vocabulary, if possible, to describe my pictures/drawings

I checked my punctuation and spelling for correctness

I used capital letters at the beginning of sentences and for proper names.

Exchange your booklet with classmates for a peer-revision session, followed by a peer editing session. Consider your classmate's comments and teacher comments. Then revise and edit your booklet before turning it as your Final Version for a grade.
